Students who live outside Crystal Lake Public Library's service area and attend a school in Crystal Lake Elementary District 47 are eligible for the library's new student access card! Your Crystal Lake Public Library has always prioritized lifelong learning. It's one of our guiding service directions at the library, and we are so excited to take a big step forward in that direction starting this August.

Through a partnership with Crystal Lake Elementary District 47, the library is able to extend access to all students in the district, regardless of residency. Students who live in the city of Crystal Lake, as well as any children who qualify for a free or reduced lunch under the Illinois Cards for Kids Act, will continue to be eligible for a CLPL card.

Students who live outside city limits, but attend a District 47 school, will be eligible for our new student access card. This card will provide students with the ability to check out up to three books or audiobooks at a time, to register for library programs, and to access library databases for all their homework and research needs. Our hope is this partnership will allow the library to better support our students, teachers and schools on a path to lifelong learning!

Parents and/or guardians can bring children into the library to get a student access card starting Aug. 1. More information can be found on the library website, clpl.org.

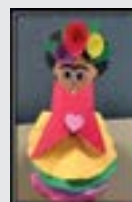

Library Board Trustee Mary Alice Fellers Retires After 24 Years of Service

Mary Alice Fellers moved to Crystal Lake with her husband, Jim, and son, Henry, 30 years ago. About six years later, Fellers joined the Crystal



Lake Public Library Board of Trustees because she wanted to serve the community she lived in.

"I appreciate the important role libraries play in promoting literacy and lifelong learning," Fellers said. "So when a seat opened up on the CLPL Board, I welcomed the opportunity to serve as a trustee."

Fellers was appointed to the board in 1999 by the late Mayor Aaron Shepley. She's served on nearly every subcommittee and as a liaison to the Friends of the Library group. Currently, she is vice-president of the library board. She's also held the treasurer duties in years past.

During her tenure, Fellers has strived to be a strong advocate for an open and transparent governing process to help engage the public and build trust. She's always worked to manage taxpayer dollars responsibly.

Communicating the value of public libraries and raising awareness about what the library offers has been a challenge for libraries at times.

"Libraries connect people to information and to each other," Fellers said. "They play a vital role in providing unfettered access, without judgment, to information, ideas and differing perspectives on issues. As libraries evolve, they will remain relevant in meeting the needs of the community."

Fellers, an avid user of audiobooks, plans to continue visiting CLPL as a patron. She likes to listen to audiobooks on long drives, while she works in the yard and while on her treadmill. She enjoys geocaching, especially targeting select challenges. She's found caches in 31 states to date. Fellers volunteers with other organizations including Cycling Without Age McHenry County, a group that
